Hearing Minutes: The applicants Lee Nardyz and Susan Nardyz accompanied by their attorney Christopher Woodley, Esquire appeared before the Board seeking approval for an Application for Class "B" B/W/L 7 Day License. The applicants were sworn in. Woodley stated that Mrs. Nardyz has been in the restaurant industry since her first job. Nardyz confirmed this, noting that her first position was at Dunkin Donuts, and that she has worked as a bartender, server, busser, and manager throughout her career. She further stated that both she and Mr. Nardyz will be involved in the daily operations of the restaurant, along with full-time employees. Both owners are TIPS/TAM certified, and all employees will be required to maintain the same certification. Woodley noted that the proposed restaurant location is the former Don's Seafood Chophouse, which was previously licensed. Mrs. Nardyz explained that the concept is an oyster-centered restaurant featuring expedition-style shucking, with plans to offer 10–12 varieties of oysters sourced from Canada to Virginia. The menu will also include steak, chicken, and pasta. The restaurant will operate six days a week, remaining closed on Tuesdays, with hours from 11:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Board Attorney Hank Fisher entered (Applicant's Exhibit #1) Pictures of the Property and (Applicant's Exhibit #2) Floor Plan into the record. The applicants explained that the layout will remain largely the same, with an extension of the bar seating area. The restaurant will include a raw bar, high-top tables, and overflow dining on the left side of the space, which will also be used for events. The seating capacity will be approximately 102 seats in the dining area and 24 seats at the bar. No construction has been initiated pending license approval. The applicants stated they would like to offer two-piece acoustic music during happy hour from 3:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m., twice per week. There will be no games, no pool tables, and no off-sale.. Mrs. Nardyz stated she has a copy of the Board's rules and regulations and we will comply fully. Woodley also noted that Mr. Nardyz is the resident agent on the application. Mr. Nardyz confirmed this and stated he obtained all required signatures. He acknowledged that any future changes to the license will require Board approval. Chairman Nichols asked about the proposed bar expansion; the applicants reiterated that construction will only proceed with the Board's permission. Chairman Nichols also confirmed that the lease is in order, and attorney Fisher stated that it is.								
The Board tentatively approved the application for Brine Oyster Social for a Class "B" B/W/L 7 Day License pending all required documentation.

Hearing Minutes: The applicants Chatcha Latkan and Yi Dong accompanied by their attorney Joseph E. Moore, Esquire appeared before the Board seeking approval for a Class "B" B/W 7 Day License Application for transfer. The applicants were sworn in. Moore explained that Latkan is the manager, Beni is an operator of the restaurant, and Dong is the owner and resident agent. The restaurant has been previously licensed, and the applicants intend to take over the operation with no changes to the existing business model. Moore stated that the restaurant will have 46 seats, a full-service kitchen, no bar, and will continue as the only Thai restaurant in the area. Latkan agreed that there will be no operational changes. Board Attorney Hank Fisher entered (Applicant's Exhibit #1) Floor Plan, (Applicant's Exhibit #2) Restaurant Menu, and (Applicant's Exhibit #3) TIPS/TAM Certifications into the record, which includes five certifications, covering the two applicants as well as additional employees. Moore stated that he advised the applicants that one certified individual must always remain on the premises, and that only employees who are TIPS/TAM certified are permitted to serve alcoholic beverages. Latkan agreed. Moore asked both Latkan and Beni to confirm that they completed the certification training, and both stated they had. Dong confirmed he is the owner and resident agent of the restaurant, both presently and previously. He stated that he obtained all required signatures on the application and understands that, in the event of a violation, he must appear before the Board. Latkan and Beni also confirmed that they have prior experience selling alcoholic beverages in Mississippi. The applicants indicated that the restaurant would operate seven days a week, and certified employees will be responsible for checking IDs. Moore stated that customers have consistently requested the ability to purchase alcoholic beverages with their meals, and some customers have left due to the lack of beer and wine options. He stated it is reasonably necessary to offer alcoholic beverages to meet customer expectations. Latkan agreed. Commissioner Cropper asked whether the applicants understood that a newly hired employee who has not yet obtained certification may not serve alcohol, even if waiting on a table where alcohol is requested. Moore stated that he advised them of this requirement, and all

applicants confirmed they understand. Chairman Nichols stated that he wanted to ensure the applicants fully understand the Board’s rules and regulations to avoid any violations. Moore asked the applicants whether they had ever had violations in the past, and they stated they had not.

Hearing Minutes: The applicants Spencer Cropper, Aaron Schroeder, and Joseph Rattigan accompanied by their attorney Mark S. Cropper, Esquire, appeared before the Board seeking approval for a Class "B" B/W/L 7 Day License Application for Transfer from The Players Club, LLC to RRGc Restaurant, LLC Turn at River Run. The applicants were sworn in. Attorney Cropper asked Rattigan, Schroeder, and Spencer Cropper whether the information provided in the application was correct, and all applicants confirmed it was. Cropper stated that Spencer Cropper is the qualified resident agent for the license but will not be involved in the business operations. S. Cropper confirmed that he obtained all required signatures and noted his previous experience serving as a resident agent for Kaiju Sushi Bar in Berlin. Attorney Cropper explained that the restaurant has been operating as Kim Acton's Starr Restaurant and that it is the intent of the applicants to continue operating on a full-time basis. Hours of operation will be determined by the golf course schedule and customer demand, and the restaurant will remain open to the public. All employees will be TIPS/TAM certified, and a certified individual will be required to always be on the premises. Rattigan agreed to these requirements. Attorney Cropper stated that the closing between the current owner and Rattigan will occur next week, and Rattigan will notify Administrator Payne once the closing is complete. He further stated that he prepared a lease agreement between the property-holding entity and the entity seeking the liquor license. Rattigan confirmed this and acknowledged that structural changes to the property may not be made without prior approval from the Board. Attorney Cropper stated that the applicants intend to continue serving alcoholic beverages to golfers while they are on the course, consistent with current operations, and that the license transfer is requested to maintain the same privileges. Rattigan confirmed that any special events held at the restaurant would require contacting Administrator Payne. The applicants intend to continue serving customers in the same capacity as the previous operation. Rattigan testified that he has 20 years of experience in the golf and food service industries, including roles as general manager and operations manager. He stated that Nesbitt has extensive experience in the golf industry and

will assist with the transition following the purchase. Nesbitt will serve as the on-site General Manager and will oversee the daily operations and staff management. Schroeder, a member license applicant, stated that he will be the golf course operator, consistent with his background. Commissioner Cropper asked whether alcoholic beverages would be served on the golf course, and the applicants stated “YES.” Commissioner Pusey asked about hours of operation, and the applicants stated that they will determine appropriate hours once they assume control of the business, noting the restaurant will not operate late at night. Commissioner Cropper asked if a special license is needed for events, and the applicants responded that it is not. Chairman Nichols confirmed that the lease was in order and requested a copy of the site plan.

The Board tentatively approved the request for a Class “B” B/W/L 7 Day License application for transfer from The Players Club, LLC to RRG Restaurant, LLC.

Hearing Minutes: The applicants Matthew Odachowski and Tyler Odachowski accompanied by their attorney Hugh Cropper, Esquire appeared before the Board seeking approval for application for a Promoter’s License beginning on Wednesday, September 9, 2026, through Saturday, September 12, 2026, hours for alcoholic beverage sales to begin at 1:00 p.m. until 10:30 p.m. each day at the Ocean City Inlet Parking Lot. The applicants and witnesses were sworn in. Cropper questioned applicant Tyler Odachowski, who confirmed that he collected all required signatures for the application, completed the application himself, and was involved in last year’s event, which was successful and conducted cooperatively with the Town of Ocean City. Cropper noted that the town were in support of this event and the promoters back again this year. Tyler Odachowski agreed. Cropper requested an amendment to the application, submitting (Applicant’s Exhibit #1) Application Amendment for Hours of Operation. He explained that alcoholic beverage service must stop at 10:30 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday and proposed a revised start time of 11:00 a.m. to accommodate attendees arriving earlier in the day. Cropper stated that Matthew Odachowski has sponsored the event for 13 years, and acquired ownership of the event two years ago, and operated it last summer under the promoter’s license without any issues. Matthew Odachowski agreed. Cropper noted that the hours of operation are authorized by the Ocean City Mayor and City Council, with whom all details have been reviewed. M. Odachowski confirmed that the event will have Ocean City Police presence as well as hired private security. M. Odachowski stated the environment is fully controlled, including security, vendors, and monitoring. Cropper then called Tim Price. Price works for Royal Plus and is a retired Ocean City Police Officer and former Fire Department member

with more than 40 years of service. Price stated that he has/will provide security plans, life safety plans, assessments, and analysis for the Rock and Ride event. As both a professional and a citizen, he has supported the event since it originated as “Bike Week.” He testified that the applicants have always been supportive and compliant, employ safety officers and metal detectors, and that he is not aware of any issues. He strongly supports the event. The next witness, Kevin Chmeilewski, testified that he has provided security for more than 25 years, including for the White House, multiple governors, inaugurations, and Super Bowls. He stated that he brings his own children to the event and would not do so if there were any safety concerns. For the Rock and Ride event, he will provide safety and security and work closely with the Ocean City Police Department (OCPD). The next witness, Nicole Charvat, testified that she handles all marketing and public relations for the event and works closely with OCPD, and Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT). She described promotional safety campaigns, including MDOT motorcycle safety videos and a partnership with 98 Rock radio station. She stated that the promoters fund these campaigns at their own expense. Charvat also said she manages two large Facebook groups and that ticket holders receive a free bus pass, allowing them to leave motorcycles overnight with security protection. Cropper stated that, as a condition of approval, the applicants agree to all restrictions imposed last year, which resulted in a successful event. Cropper entered (Applicant’s Exhibit #2) Site Plan and stated that all alcohol service will be by TIPS/TAM certified staff. Tyler Odachowski stated that last year’s event was very successful, raised money for charities, received strong business support, and could not have succeeded without that support. Commissioner Cropper asked how IDs will be verified. R. Odachowski stated they will likely use scanners this year; previously, IDs were checked manually, wristbands were used and inspected for tampering, and spotters were stationed at the bar, creating a three-step verification process before alcohol could be purchased. Commissioner Pusey asked whether there is only one way into the venue. R. Odachowski stated that driving into the inlet provides one entrance and one exit, while entry into the event itself has three entrances. Commissioner Pusey asked how exits will be monitored; R. Odachowski stated there are security guards stationed at each entrance and exit. Commissioner Cropper asked how many individuals TIPS/TAM will be certified. R. Odachowski stated all current staff are certified, with 16 additional individuals to be certified, anyone serving alcohol will be certified. Cropper asked whether door staff are certified; R. Odachowski stated that some are, and additional staff can be certified as needed. Witness Susan Jones, representing the Ocean City Hospitality Association, testified in support of the promoters. She stated that they consistently ensure appropriate security and consider impacts on local businesses, striving to help them succeed. Administrator Payne noted that paperwork from the OCPD did not mention the amended hours and asked whether the OCPD is aware of the changes. Cropper confirmed they are, stating the times were negotiated openly with the department. Commissioner Cropper requested clear confirmation from OCPD that they have been fully informed of the revised hours.

Hearing Minutes: The applicants Danielle Nauschuetz and Hansen Foscolo accompanied by their attorney Hugh Cropper, Esquire, appeared before the Board seeking approval for an Application for a Promoter’s License for Wednesday, September 9, 2026, through Saturday, September 12, 2026, Hours for Alcoholic Beverage Sales to begin at 10:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. each day, and Sunday, September 13, 2026, Hours for Alcoholic Beverage Sales to begin at 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. at the Ocean City Convention Center. The applicants and witnesses were sworn in. Cropper stated that he represents Event Coordination’s Support System, the company established to operate the food and beverage operations at the Ocean City Convention Center. He explained that the operating rights for those services have been assigned to the applicants. Cropper stated that Foscolo is the resident agent and has been advised of his rights and responsibilities in that role, and Foscolo agreed. Foscolo testified that he and Nauschuetz collected all the signatures on the application and completed the application together. Both applicants stated that this would be their first alcoholic beverage license. Nauschuetz stated that she is TIPS/TAM certified and has been advised of her rights and responsibilities as a license holder. Both Nauschuetz and Foscolo testified that they have reviewed the Board’s Rules and Regulations and understand. Cropper noted that the venue for this event is smaller and that members of the Odachowski family, who are related to the applicants, will help oversee and assist with the event. Witness Kevin Chmeilewski testified that the event is simply a meet-and-greet with no concerts. Commissioner Cropper asked whether there will be any type of entertainment. The applicants stated that there will be no concerts or Disc Jockey (DJ). Vendors may have radios and may play music at their individual locations. Witness Susan Jones, representing the Ocean City Hospitality Association, testified that she has known Nauschuetz for several years. She spoke to her character, describing her as a very organized professional who is helpful to others. Jones stated that she also supports Hansen and the event. Cropper added that the testimony provided during the prior Rock and Ride hearing is

applicable, as the events are similar in nature. Chairman Nichols asked about security plans. Foscolo stated that security will be stationed at each entrance , and the company National X will provide metal detectors. Personnel will be positioned at entrances to check IDs and bags. Commissioner Pusey asked whether the applicants anticipate attendance numbers. Hansen stated that attendees come and go throughout the day, so no firm count is available. Commissioner Pusey further asked about transportation between sites; Foscolo stated that individuals who purchase a ticket for the inlet event receive a free bus pass and may ride to this event at no cost throughout the day.
